Michigan at Gettysburg

July 1-5, 2010

Experience Gettysburg by paying homage to the brave men and women from Michigan who helped change the course of history! Join Hometown History Tours & CW historian David Ingall as we recount the heroic contributions of the Michigan Regiments who served and sacrificed to preserve our Nation.

- Stand on the hallowed ground where the 24th Michigan was nearly decimated as they courageously held up Confederate advances during the opening battle of Gettysburg.
- Visit the once bloodstained Wheatfield (called the *Harvest of Death*) where Colonel Harrison Jeffords, the highest ranking Union officer to die by bayonet, was mortally wounded while trying to retrieve and protect the 4th Michigan's national flag.
- Walk the site where Colonel Norman Hall's brigade, which included the 7th Michigan, became the final Union troops to repulse Pickett's charge.
- Listen closely, perhaps you'll hear the famous Custer rally cry: "C'mon you Wolverines!" when we visit East Cavalry Field, the site where the Boy General and his acclaimed Michigan Cavalry Brigade bravely charged the once invincible J.E.B. Stuart & company in what's known as the *"Cavalry battle that saved the Union."* Tour includes admission to this famous battle reenactment.

We'll visit sites of interest including the Gettysburg National Cemetery, David Wills House and Eisenhower Farm. Special dining experiences include the Historic 1776 Dobbin House Tavern and Farnsworth Inn.
